Highway N shut down for move of log cabin

The move of a log cabin to Cottleville's Legacy Park shut down a stretch of Highway N for about an hour this morning. Mayor Don Yarber said the shutdown occurred from about 10 to 11 a.m.

The cabin was moved from a site on Eagle Hill Lane and will be at the trailhead of the Cottleville Trail, which will open in the fall. The park is near Cottleville City Hall.

The trail, which will be part of the Dardenne Greenway, will run for a mile on the south side of Dardenne Creek between Highway N and Mid Rivers Mall Drive. The greenway is part of a regional system of parks and trails planned by the regional Great Rivers Greenway organization.

The structure was donated to Cottleville by Jeff Kolb, a developer, a few years ago. The cabin, which dates back to the 1800s, originally was on a site near Augusta and was moved to Cottleville several decades ago.
